

Christian Nationalism: U.S.

Fit a "broad definition" of Christian nationalism: • 45% of Americans

- 65% of Black Protestants
- Over 50% of "non-evangelical" white Protestants
- About 1/3 of Hispanic Catholics

Have heard "nothing at all" about it:

Nationalism: A Very Short Introduction



Nationalism: Positive Factors

- understands positive value of 'communal solidarity' arising from shared citizenship/ ethnicity (Koyzis)
- corrective to hyper-individualism

Culture Christianity

Nationalism: Core Traits

- Nostalgia: return to a time when group "like us" had cultural/political influence
- Threat response: this nation/group embodies values/traditions that are under attack
- Ultimate evil: "being ruled by someone unlike oneself" (Koyzis)



Christian Nationalism: Two Forms

- using Christianity as a marker of national/ethnic identity to distinguish 'insiders' from 'outsiders'
- using explicit theological statements as a justification for aggression/authoritarianism

Steven Grosby

"...belief that the nation is the instrument of God and the home of his people, so that it becomes the only goal worthy of pursuit.... God's vision for the nation, as defined by 'true believers,' demands unquestioned and uncompromising loyalty. [This leads] to the attempt] to eliminate all differing views and interests for the sake of one vision of what the nation has been and should be."

Modified to add components specific to Christian Nationalism



Christian Nationalism: Errors

Substitution: State for Church
Promises for God's People=for Nation

• Confusion:

- The Nation's Ways=God's Ways
- The Nation's Heroes=God's Heroes
- Duty to Nation=Duty to God



Christian Nationalism: Core Error

• "...Christianity exists to build a social order in step with a national or ethnic identity."

Gospel Peace Know What Jesus Says

Culture
